**Pre-op Bloodwork: Bloodwork is recommended for all pets before surgery. In some cases, the doctor will require bloodwork in order to proceed with surgery.**

*If a problem exists in the bloodwork, it can determine whether surgery can be done now, or if your pet's health should be managed with medications or IV fluids before, during, and after surgery. Early detection of diseases is always of the utmost importance in keeping your pet healthy, which is why we recommend bloodwork, especially in older pets. In addition to analyzing the blood cells, our veterinarian can look at the function of your pet's organs by examining the blood chemistry.*

**~Exam and Bloodwork must be done within 6 months prior to the surgery**

**~Pet must be current on Rabies vaccine**

\*Propofol is an intravenous anesthetic injection for use in pets as follows: for induction of anesthesia, for maintenance of general anesthesia for up to 20 minutes, and for inductions of general anesthesia where maintenance is provided by inhalant (isoflurane).
