Deep dental cleaning and polishing includes the following:

- Sedation/tranquilization
- General anesthesia (isoflurane=gas)
- IV Catheter placement/Fluid therapy during procedure
- Ultrasonic scaling, prophy polishing, and fluoride treatment
- Pulse ox monitoring
- Pain injection and Rx medication(s) to go home (oral antibiotics/pain meds)

Pre-op Bloodwork: (Blood work is recommended for all pets before surgery.)

If a problem exists in the bloodwork, it can determine whether surgery can be done now, or if your pet's health should be managed with medications or IV fluids before, during, and after surgery. Early detection of diseases is always of the utmost importance in keeping your pet healthy, which is why we recommend blood work, especially in older pets. In addition to analyzing the blood cells, your veterinarian can look at the function of your pet's organs by looking at the blood chemistry.

Notes:

***Exam and bloodwork must be done within 6 months before the surgery.**

***Pet must be current on the Rabies vaccine.**

Propofol: (Recommended for all pets before surgery: **required for pets over 8 years old)**

Up to 20 lb	\$48	Propofol is an intravenous anesthetic injection for use in pets as follows: for inductions of anesthesia, for maintenance of general anesthesia for up to 20 minutes, and for induction of general anesthesia where maintenance is provided by inhalant (gas).
